

Sermon Title: Reintroducing Luke: How to study and benefit from the Gospels, Part 2

Main Idea:

This message explains four key steps that will help you benefit from your study of the gospel of Luke: understanding the genre, identifying the main point, discerning the purpose of the Gospel, and recognizing how it functions as a narrative.

Ten Study Questions:

- Explain in your own words each of the four principles discussed in the sermon for understanding the Gospels better?
- Why is it important to understand the genre of the Gospel of Luke, and what genre is it classified as?
- What role does the resurrection play in how the Gospels are written and understood?
- Luke is like other books, but what were some of the ways that this message said it was unique?
- How does Luke structure his Gospel, and what literary techniques does he use to convey his message?
- In what ways does Luke connect his narrative to the Old Testament, and why is this significant?
- Why is understanding how Luke wants you to respond to his message important?
- How does the sermon explain the importance of context and literary forms, such as parables and narratives, in the Gospels?
- What were some of the different techniques Luke used in his writing that will help you understand what he is communicating?
- What are some of the main things you learned for approaching stories within Luke to gain a deeper understanding of their significance?
- Why do you think the message concluded by emphasizing the need for the Holy Spirit's guidance in studying and understanding the Gospels?
